What a smooth start to 2020 we have had. Very few tears from the parents and the children have been brave as well! Keep positive and calm if your little one starts to cling a few weeks in, and talk to an educator.

Communication

Remember 3 year olds are looking at the world from their own egocentric perspective. Talk to us if you are unsure of the messages they are relaying. Remember that other little people are all operating from the same perspective where they think they are the centre of the universe.

It is hard to share space and resources with 24 other little humans where everyone is still learning to regulate their emotions and how to navigate interactions and inevitable conflict. Your child may misinterpret a peer's clumsy knocking down of their blocks as deliberate and mean. Superhero friends can accidentally hurt their friends and not have the social skills to reassure their friend of the lack of intent. 3 year olds have often not developed the empathy to understand a companion's feelings.

Talk to your child about their day and reassure them that their peers are still learning how to be a good friend. Be empathic but positive and never label another child as NAUGHTY. Once you put a label on other children, your child will follow suit and will use that child's name to apply blame for anything that goes wrong for them at preschool from that time.

If you have concerns, bring them up with us, out of earshot of children.

Emergency Drills

All week we will be practicing our snake drills, emergency evacuations and lockdown drills. This is done in a calm and fun way. If you happen to be around when a drill is underway, you will be included.

Educators talk to the children about what we are doing and why in a way that should not alarm them. We convey that everything is fine and we are just pretending so that we would all know what to do if there was a problem. This can be tricky with 3 year olds due to their language development and understanding of the world.

If your little one is confused, calmly reassure them that all is well and their educators are here to keep them safe and we just practice so everyone knows their job if there was a problem.

Driveway at Woodburn

Parking at our Woodburn campus is far from optimal. Unfortunately, this is out of our control.

Please park at the public pool and walk up the ramp or get some great exercise by parking in the school carpark off Woodburn Street and walking up to the preschool. There is cover and pram/wheelchair access all the way.

DO NOT PARK IN THE DRIVEWAY OR ON SCHOOL LANE!

Pedestrians need to use the footpaths on School Lane. If you are parked across footpaths, families will be forced to walk on the road with their young children.

Don't be rude to food!

Fussy eating is normal, in fact well over half of toddlers and preschool age children will display fussy eating behaviors' before they reach school. It's part of a child's development a way of exploring their environment, the food you provide and of course a way to assert their independence.

Remember that you are the parent – and a Parents parent's job is to provide foods that a child likes, and is children learning to like (new foods), and it's the child's job to decide what they will eat each meal.

provide, decide. -FUSSY EATING MANTRA

Keep your expectations realistic, start with small steps such as a child touching or licking a food, and keep meal times stress free and positive. Praise the progress, and ignore the fuss a child may display.

And when in doubt remind your children "Don't be rude to food". Create a positive vibe around the table by questioning children about the colour of food; or whether a food is crunchy or soft; or sweet, sour or salty, rather than letting them complain that they don't like it.

We can plan and program for children's learning more effectively when we have a better understanding of their learning styles. Already we have witnessed so much new and interesting learning. Children are making new friendships, exploring their environment and learning through play. This year, one of our ongoing projects will be focusing on "place" and "country". We acknowledge country every morning, paying our respects to the traditional owners of the land where we work and play. Throughout the day we care for our preschool environment, taking time to immerse ourselves in the awe and wonder nature has to offer. We are inviting families this year to come on this journey with us, using literacy as the impetus to share your family's connection to country and place. Shortly we will be sending home a journal and the story of possum magic. If you are not familiar with the story of Possum Magic it is well known

children's book by Australian author Mem Fox. Grandma Possum and Hush travel around Australia on a quest to make Hush visible again after Grandma used her magic to make him invisible. This story sits perfectly with our own learning about the Aboriginal nations of our land. For some time, we have been listening to a podcast called "Little Yarns" at rest time. Each "Little Yarn" takes us on an adventure to a new place to learn the language, and most importantly, to enjoy the yarns about travel and a new place. If you are off on a holiday or planning on a visit to somewhere special, please let us know. We would love your family to take Hush the possum on an adventure with you. Alternatively, you can take Hush to the local places that are important to your family.

All families have been invited to our documentation on the Google platform. There are two folders one for photographs and the other has your child's summative assessment. This document will be added to throughout the yar. We include group and individual learning stories. You will not see a new entry every week, we document significant learning.
